

In celebration of Georgia STEM Day, MMGYSTC hosted a virtual event on May 7 called "Bee a Pollinator." Over 300 students from Lakeview Primary in Milledgeville participated in the event. Students viewed East Georgia State College's live honeybee cam (http://www.ega.edu/bee-cam) and were able to see real honeybees entering and exiting the hives at the college. Students then learned how bees pollinate by making a model honeybee and using powdered sugar and cocoa powder to demonstrate the pollination process. Students then "re-engineered" their honeybee model to make it an even better pol-

Since 2015, Magnolia Midlands Georgia Youth Science & Technology Center has worked with EGSC to raise awareness, interest, and concern for the loss of the honeybees and to connect this issue with STEM fields. Through this unique partnership, MMGYSTC and EGSC are promoting the plight of the honeybees and raising STEM awareness in Southeast Georgia and beyond! MMGYSTC is located at the Fulford Center.

THE FULFORD CENTER REMEMBERS THE LIFE OF PETE CORRELL

A.D. "Pete" Correll, a man who generously gave to East Georgia State College (EGSC) along with many other organizations throughout his life, passed away Tuesday, May 25 at the age of 80.

Pete and his wife, Ada Lee, believed that the key to success in the future is in providing an educated work force that is capable of seizing on the job opportunities of tomorrow's businesses. To help educate and provide opportunities, they kindly donated across the state especially in their hometowns of Glynn County and Emanuel County.

In 2010, the couple partnered with EGSC to gift the Sudie A. Fulford Community Learning Center to the college as a gift in honor of Ada Lee's mother Sudie Fulford. Pete and Ada Lee's vision was that the Fulford Center would serve as an educational and cultural hub to the Emanuel County area, filled with planetarium shows, workshops, exhibitions, classes and performances for people of all ages. To date, many lives have been enriched by the opportunities at the Fulford Center.

On the fifth anniversary of the Fulford Center, Pete and Ada Lee announced the Correll Foundation committed \$900,000 over the following five years to estab-


