

# STUDENTS BECOME CERTIFIED SITTERS

Recently, the University of Georgia Extension provided a four-day training at the center to enhance knowledge and safety skills for youth caring for children. Two days of the training consisted of CPR and First Aid training provided by Emanuel County EMS and delivered by Russell Thornton. Additional instruction was provided by UGA Extension agents Marnie Dekle and Angie Daughtry. Sixteen Emanuel and Candler County youth were trained and certified. Participants received certificates for course completion and CPR and First Aid cards.



# SAT REVIEW SESSIONS ARE SCHEDULED



There are many parts of a successful college application, the most important of which is high school grades. The second most important part is the SAT score.

In an effort to familiarize students with the SAT test directions, the types of questions on the test, and the necessary skills for SAT success in the math and verbal sections, the Fulford Center will

offer two review sessions for area students. SAT math review will be held October 7-10 from 4:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. SAT verbal review will take place October 14-17 from 4:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. The fee is \$10 for one week or \$15 for both weeks. Students will receive a test review packet and sample test sections.

The review sessions aim to equip students to achieve the highest possible score on the test. The sessions are taught by highly qualified and experienced instructors.

Students should see their school counselor to register, or they may contact the center.

Max McKelvey, Oatland Island Education Coordinator, will be on hand to assist with the stargazing and to share his passion for the stars.
