



Dr. Cunha,

Effective December 31, 2019 we will end the degree in Recreation. Due to low enrollment numbers and not one single student has graduated from our Recreation major, my recommendation is to drop the major. Classroom enrollment is low in most classes. Most students taking the courses are not recreation majors. Students are not performing as expected.

We will continue to offer recreation courses, but only as direct studies. A transfer pathway for recreation has been developed for those students who still want to earn a BA degree from a four-year institution.

Dropping this program will not affect any faculty members or students currently enrolled if they are recreation majors. Current students have been advised of the situation.

We offered a recreation major 30 years ago when I first arrived, but during my first 5 years, we only had one major. The program was dropped.

We need to drop this major before the catalogue is published.
